From today to Sunday, September 10th, the Fiat Auto Proving Ground in Balocco (Vercelli) will be the venue of the second edition of formula ATA, and IVECO will take part to the event as one of the most important sponsors.

The 2006 edition of Formula ATA will be richer due to the international meeting "Integrated Chassis Control" during which new advanced "by-wire" systems for vehicle performance and safety will be presented.
