



Iveco and Formula ATA at the Fiat Industrial Village

Iveco hosted the seventh edition of the Formula Electric and Hybrid that was held last weekend on the Iveco test track, adjacent to the Fiat Industrial Village, the first Fiat Industrial multipurpose sales and service centre recently opened.

This technical-sporting event, organised by the Associazione Tecnica dell'Automobile (ATA), dedicated to university students in order to stimulate and reward the enthusiasm, creativity, skills and team spirit of young engineers who expressed ideas and new technological solutions aimed at reducing the environmental impact of vehicles by using alternative energy sources. At the competition, reserved for cars of an open wheel formula with electric and hybrid drive, 13 university teams participated with a total presence of about 300 students from around the world.
